The Department of Dramatic Art (DDA) provides students with a comprehensive degree (B.A.) which focuses on the core of theatre: acting, directing, design, history, and analysis in Dramatic Arts. Students also can immerse themselves in all aspects of production through work with the Kenan Theatre Company's (KTC) student-driven main stage season. Students perform, design and manage productions directed by guests and faculty members. KTC is led by student producers choosing and managing the season. 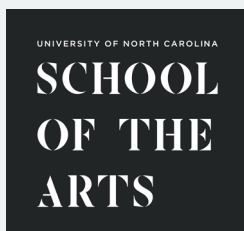
